SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Psalm 30 – p. 611 in hymnal – Leader reads odd verses, the people read evens

Galatians 6:1-16 (NIV) - Doing Good to All

Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted. ² Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. ³ If anyone thinks they are something when they are not, they deceive themselves. ⁴ Each one should test their own actions. Then they can take pride in themselves alone, without comparing themselves to someone else, ⁵ for each one should carry their own load. ⁶ Nevertheless, the one who receives instruction in the word should share all good things with their instructor.

⁷ Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. ⁸ Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. ⁹ Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. ¹⁰ Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

¹¹ See what large letters I use as I write to you with my own hand!
¹² Those who want to impress people by means of the flesh are trying to compel you to be circumcised. The only reason they do this is to avoid being persecuted for the cross of Christ. ¹³ Not even those who are circumcised keep the law, yet they want you to be circumcised that they may boast about your circumcision in the flesh. ¹⁴ May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. ¹⁵ Neither circumcision nor uncircumcision means anything; what counts is the new creation. ¹⁶ Peace and mercy to all who follow this rule—to the Israel of God.

Amos 1:1-2

The words of Amos, one of the shepherds of Tekoa—the vision he saw concerning Israel two years before the earthquake, when Uzziah was king of Judah and Jeroboam son of Jehoash^[a] was king of Israel. ² He said:

"The Lord roars from Zion and thunders from Jerusalem;

the pastures of the shepherds dry up, and the top of Carmel withers."

Amos 2:6-7

⁶ This is what the Lord says:

"For three sins of Israel,

even for four, I will not relent.

They sell the innocent for silver, and the needy for a pair of sandals.

⁷ They trample on the heads of the poor as on the dust of the ground and deny justice to the oppressed.

Amos 5:21-24

"I hate, I despise your religious festivals; your assemblies are a stench to me.
²² Even though you bring me burnt offerings and grain offerings,

- I will not accept them.
- Though you bring choice fellowship offerings, I will have no regard for them.
- ²³ Away with the noise of your songs!
 I will not listen to the music of your harps.
 ²⁴ But let justice roll on like a river,

righteousness like a never-failing stream!

Amos 6:1

Woe to you who are complacent in Zion, and to you who feel secure on Mount Samaria, you notable men of the foremost nation, to whom the people of Israel come!

Amos 9:11-15

¹¹ "In that day
"I will restore David's fallen shelter—

I will repair its broken walls
and restore its ruins—
and will rebuild it as it used to be,

¹² so that they may possess the remnant of Edom

and all the nations that bear my name,^[a]"

declares the Lord, who will do these things.
¹³ "The days are coming," declares the Lord,
"when the reaper will be overtaken by the plowman

and the planter by the one treading grapes.

New wine will drip from the mountains

and flow from all the hills,

¹⁴ and I will bring my people Israel back from exile.^[b]
