The Bethlehem Ladies hosted their annual Guest Night on Tuesday, September 17<sup>th</sup>. There were 26 people in attendance. Our speakers for the evening were WASH for Life President Steve Hamer along with his daughter Shannon and granddaughter Charlotte. They spoke about their mission work to provide clean water to communities in Malawi. It started out with a small group of girls who

wanted to make a difference. The group, Girls Reaching Out (GRO) was formed in 2013 and over the years has funded 34 boreholes in Malawi. Each borehole affects on average 500 kids,their communities, and their schools – 17,000 students in total. The total construction cost of a well is \$7,500. What an amazing accomplishment and difference this has made in so many lives. Thank you to all who took time to join us! It was enjoyed by all.


#### From the Historical Records of Bethlehem U.C.C.

Taken from the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Booklet for Bethlehem United Church of Christ:

"During Bethlehem's hundred year history 567 persons were baptized, 462 were confirmed, 186 couples joined in marriage, and 206 persons laid to rest. The present communicant membership is 163. Baptized but not confirmed membership is 59."

#### As of September 15, 2024:

Persons baptized is 802
Persons confirmed is 719
Couples married is 307
Persons laid to rest is 346
Communicant membership is 175
Baptized but not confirmed is 36




