

In 1999 the Sunday School designated the month of February as Leprosy/Birthday month. The children would bring their birthday money regardless of when their birthday is. Singing "Happy Birthday still is done on the child's birthday.

Videos and stories are shared with the children to educate them on the disease of Leprosy. No matter what the amount of the collection, the Sunday School donates enough money to cure one child, using other fund-raising monies.

Today we are still asking for a child to bring .25 per your age. (Us teachers are glad we didn't raise it any higher)

We are still looking for more help in teaching Sunday School. This is not a full-time job. Teachers share weeks and set their own schedule. Lessons and supplies are provided. Feel free to sit in on any class and help with activities or just be a helper.

From the Historical Records of Bethlehem U.C.C.



This month the family and friends of Bethlehem UCC have an opportunity to be part of the next chapter of the history of Bethlehem. On Saturday, February 15, 2025, Pastor Randall Koppenhaver will be ordained. In the almost 160 year of Bethlehem's existence, this will be the third Son of the Congregation to formally answer the call to ministry.

A Son of the Congregation is someone whose faith grew over the time they were part of the Bethlehem family. Then upon completion of extensive schooling and seminary requirements to ensure they are ready for ministry, they are ordained into the ministry.

The first Son of the Congregation for Bethlehem UCC, is Albert Fischer who was ordained in 1925. The second Son of the Congregation is Kim Henning, ordained in 1982.

Now, Bethlehem will participate in this time of joy and celebration for the ordained person (Randall Koppenhaver), his family, friends and supporters.

The WISE Team at Bethlehem is waiting the results of the congregational vote on the WISE Covenant which was presented at Bethlehem UCC's Annual Meeting which will be held on January 26th.

Know that this is the beginning of WISE, not the end. Going forward we'll be looking for more involvement on how we can engage the community in mental health, like community workshops, opening our doors to organizations who might need space for meetings, training, etc. the possibilities are endless.

Below is the poster board shared by the WISE Team prior to the annual meeting. The WISE Covenant is in the Bethlehem Annual Meeting Report that was handed out to all members of Bethlehem.

What is a W.I.S.E. Congregation?

To be certified WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive and Engaged).

- To encourage our congregation to become more welcoming of those living with mental health challenges,
- To expand our inclusion of those who are living with mental health challenges,
- To be supportive of all who are affected by mental health conditions,
- To engage in ways to live our commitment to be W.I.S.E. about mental health.

Our objectives are to promote understanding and compassion, reduce stigma through education and to support connections with local community agencies that advocate for those living with these challenges. We are not doctors and cannot cure these challenges and issues, but we strive to learn ways to provide support and listen to people who need help.

One thing we have come to learn on our WISE journey is that the people we need to help the most.... are ourselves. All of us have faced challenges at times that often reflect one of the many faces of mental challenges and issues.

We want to continue to grow our WISE ministry and explore how the stigma can be reduced or removed by including teens and other young people from our community and churches; and by making monthly meetings available to anyone interested in hearing how others are dealing with issues and learning with us, in a confidential environment, that those with mental health issues are not alone.

Through our journey, here at Bethlehem, these past two years we have educated our congregation with messages, posters of information, life stories shared at worship and resources available from NAMI.




