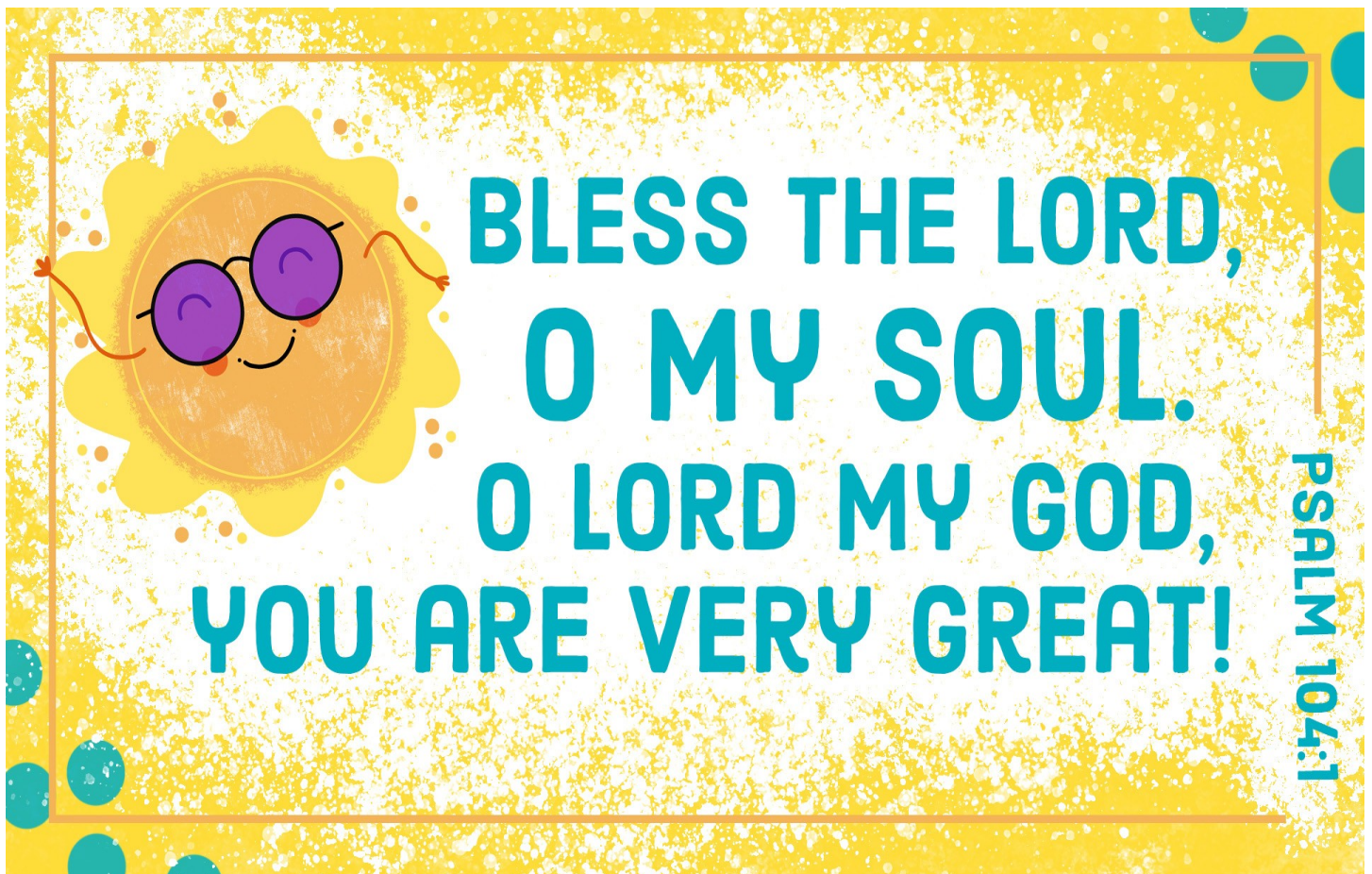
Reverend Randy's Ramblings (continued):

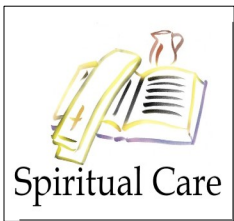

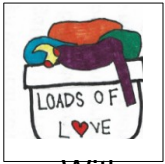

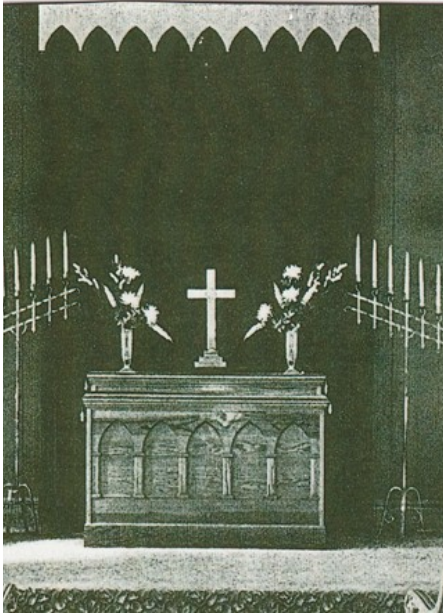
Just a reminder of the upcoming church rummage sale in August.

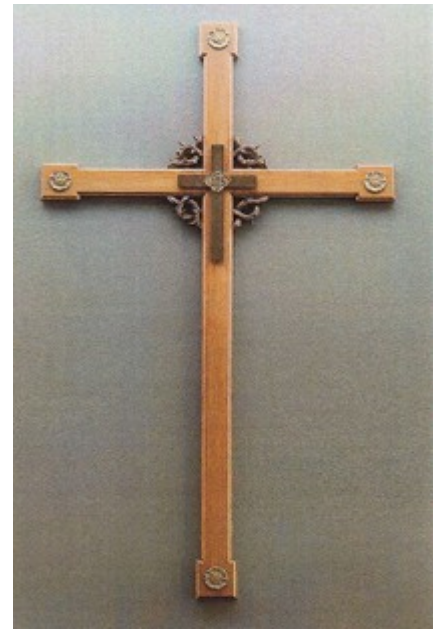
From the Church Historian:

Twenty years ago, many items were brought from the old church to the new church.

One of these was the huge cross currently in the Fellowship Hall. This cross began as a gold cross on a triad base to adorn the newly remodeled altar. In the center of the cross are the letters IHS in an ancient monogram form of the first three letters of the Greek word for Jesus. The Young People's Society (as the Youth Group) was known in those days, purchased and donated the beautiful cross.

In 1981, the sanctuary was redecorated. The gold cross was given new life by being removed from the base and attached to a wooden cross. A representation of a Crown of Thorns was added. This was hung above the newly updated altar area.

Then in 2005, this same cross was moved into the Fellowship Hall of the new church.

Please make sure that your caps are washed and free of any food or milk, otherwise they tend to mold and they are not passed along. Thank you!

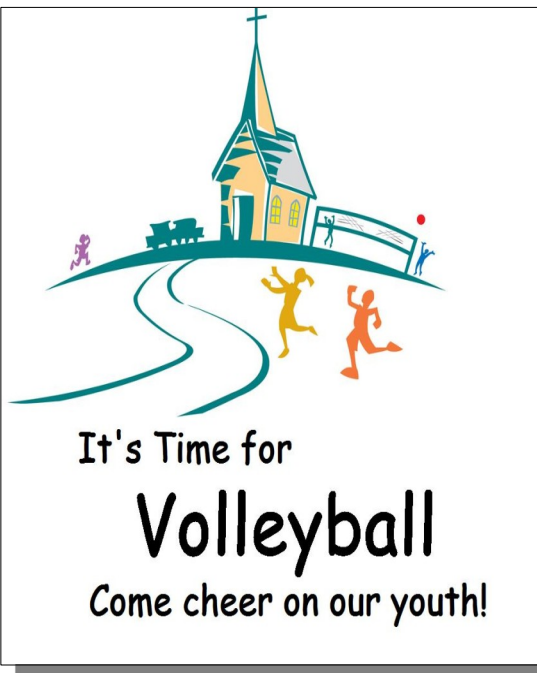

On April 17, 2025 members of the WISE Team met with Sue Shaw, Interim President NAMI of Manitowoc. Purpose of this meeting was to discuss how we can collaborate to bring NAMI's educational programs and presentations to our community.

- May 21 – Wednesday Evening, Grace UCC is hosting a panel on Youth Mental Health in the community. Experts discussing “what are the issues impacting youth, signs of mental distress and what are solutions and supports”
- 4th Monday of each month NAMI of Manitowoc meets at Manitowoc Library for in person Peer to Peer support group
- Sue attended the NAMI Conference in April, and will share materials she collected from vendors.
- NAMI Organizations throughout Wisconsin are able to collaborate with our local area

The month of May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Each Sunday during worship, the WISE Team will be taking a moment to focus on some practices for maintaining good mental health.

- Sunday, May 3, presented by Melissa Koppenhaver, by handing out blank cards with many different designs on the front. Focusing on three things; Practice gratitude, focus on positivity, stay connected. Use these cards to reach out to someone, sending encouraging message.
- Sunday, May 11, presented by Jane Umland, by handing out positive affirmation cards, with thought-provoking questions for self-reflection.
- Sunday, May 18, presented by Nancy Zimmerman, by handing out tactile strips with self-affirming messages – “You are Enough”. Help people to feel less alone.
- Sunday, May 25, will be another message on self-care

The WISE Team will meet on May 25 to discuss June 8 as “Mental Health Sunday”. Worship will be led by the WISE Team, along with a special guest speaker, Amy Potthoff, sharing her journey story and experiences with NAMI.

even when they are old they will not turn from it.

Proverbs 22:6, NIV
