Reverend Randy's Ramblings:

We, at Bethlehem, were part of the Northeast Association. Each quadrant of the state had their own associations too, roughly divided by geography and number of churches. As of the annual meeting, those four associations have been dissolved. All of the business previously handled by the associations will now be handled at the conference level.

All funds held (unless they were designated, such as scholarship funds) will be consolidated into the conference treasury. The previous system of organization was a long-standing tradition in our conference. It was tough for some delegates to let it go, but we knew it wasn't serving us well anymore and wasn't the most efficient use of staff and resources.

How will this affect you? Most likely it won't. This change wasn't done for cost-saving reasons, but rather for efficiency. No staff were terminated, and "YES," we still have to pay OCWM and our other financial commitments to the conference. I guess the functionality and expediency of the new processes remains to be seen.


Like the conference, how might we at Bethlehem make changes that will aid us in our ministry and mission long into the future? It's a tough question but is something we always need to be considering. In 2nd Corinthians 5:17 Paul writes, **"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!"** Paul knew then, what we are reluctant to accept now: In order to live lives that are centered on Christ, his teachings, and his missions, old ways of thinking and doing things must be replaced with new perspectives and ideas.


LOOKING FOR LITURGISTS!



From the Church Historian:

Stained Glass Windows in the Bethlehem Sanctuary, where did they come from:





The six stained glass windows on the east and west walls of the sanctuary were brought over from the "old" church building. Originally there were 10 large windows, a circular one, and an arched over the door way. These were in the old building as memorial gifts and had been there as long as anyone can remember. Some of those were sold to members after building addition projects. To use

these in their current location the windows were resized and refurbished. Left over pieces were fashioned into keepsake angels, crosses and butterflies. The colors found in these windows are not the vibrant reds and blues which are often seen in church windows. Instead they contain more subdued colors of lavender, green and yellow.





The five stained glass windows in the back of the sanctuary were added to the entry way of the old church in 1988 as a memorial from Dennis Meiselwitz. These had also been in the "Old" church building. These windows have some of the bright colors and well as scenes. The windows are back lit to reflect their beauty.

The third set of stained glass in the sanctuary are the two tall windows the in front of the sanctuary are in memory of David Horneck who passed away in June 2011. Added to the building in 2012; these were constructed with the idea to recreate the design and colors of the old windows.

CAPS AND EGG CARTONS:




