

Continuing the celebration of 20 years for the New church building: A look at the steeple. The steeple on the new church is the very same one that was on the old church. Here is its history:

.September 1970 lightning struck the church steeple, fire destroyed it beyond repair


.April 1971 a new steeple was purchased from a company in Kentucky at a cost of \$6,300

.October 21, 2005 a crane was used to lift the steeple off the old church. It was trucked to the grounds of the new church and set on the ground. During the next weeks the steeple was cleaned and repainted.

.November 1, 2005 a crane lifted the old steeple unto the new church building.




