




## Reverend Randy's Ramblings (continued):





## From the Church Historian:



The past several months this historian column has focused on the 20 th Anniversary of the new Bethlehem UCC building. For many years financial concerns at Bethlehem was centered on raising funds to start and then pay off the mortgage. Below find some significant dates in that process. Then also see the article from the day of celebration for the burning of the mortgage.

- **2000** – Long Range Planning Committee appointed – began looking at the future
  - Building Fund established
- **2004** May – vote to proceed with building project pending financing approval
  - December – work on a major fund raising capital campaign pledge program “Stepping Forward with Faith” begins
- **2005** March – vote to proceed with building project
  - May – groundbreaking for new building
  - June – Denmark State Bank and Bethlehem sign construction loan papers for up to \$1,200,000.
- **2006** January – first worship service in new building
  - February – Denmark State Bank and Bethlehem UCC sign mortgage note for \$919,922.80 at an interest rate of 6%
  - February - dedication of new building
  - March – Interest of \$4,599.62 and Principal of \$10,200 for first mortgage payment
  - April - open house for new building
- **2018** February – final loan payment is made
  - September – Mortgage burning ceremony
  - Mission Sunday/Mortgage Burning – September 9, 2018

On Sunday, September 9th, Bethlehem United Church of Christ celebrated its annual Mission Fest. This has traditionally been a time to listen to guest speakers tell about the great things their organization does to make our world a better place to live. This year, Bethlehem made a difference in our community. After worship and lunch, members got involved in various community service projects. These included Adopt-A-Highway Trash Clean-up, Cleaning up storm damaged trees at the Schleswig Cemetery, staining the gazebo in Kiel, filling Comfort Bags for Foster Children, tying Fleece Blankets and spending time with Senior Citizens at two local assisted living facilities. Later in the day, Bethlehem celebrated paying off the mortgage of the church building with a special service at 3:30 pm.

Special guest, Rev. Kathryn Kuhn, former pastor at Bethlehem from 2003 to 2007 reminded congregation members of the struggles and challenges to make the tough decision whether to remodel or build. Kuhn celebrated the spirit displayed as the decision to move forward emerged. She praised the dedication of Marilyn Brickbauer who tirelessly served as building fund treasurer.

Former pastor (2009 – 2016), Rev. Ashley Nolte remembered how a special financial gift from another church lifted the spirits and gave new spark to the efforts to pay off the mortgage. She reminded the congregation of a dream of being able to pay this generosity forward. She too spoke of the spirit and enthusiasm of Marilyn Brickbauer.

Bob Radder, President of the congregation expressed his gratitude to Marilyn Brickbauer, acknowledging her dedication to getting the construction bills paid, collecting the contributions, and making the monthly mortgage payments. Bob also thanked Gene Radder who as Building Committee Chairperson dealt with contractors, subcontractors, weekly meeting, sub committees; and saw the project through to the end.

A moment of silence was observed to honor and remember those who were here as the project began but are no longer with us.

Then the mortgage was burnt.

The pastoral group read a litany for Being the Church, reminding us that the building is not a place to go in to be the church, but rather a place from which to go forth into the community.





### **Loads of Love:**



The WISE Team met on September 14, 2025

The month of August's jingle change collection went to Pathways to a Better Life in Kiel. The WISE Team led Sunday Worship on August 31, 2025. With guest speakers from Pathways to a Better Life. Sue Beattie, founder and owner, shared the journey that Pathways is undertaking in our community. How Faith and Hope have guided her through this journey. A second guest, Matthew, shared his story of recovery from addiction and what he has continued to learn from Pathways, and how he is helping others with challenges of mental health.

We would like to Thank the members of our church who have helped with the funds raised for us to sponsor an event as a community service to the Kiel area. The presenter is Officer Adam Meyers from Hartford, WI, founder of “stopthethreatstopthestigma.org”. Officer Meyers will share his story and describe the work he has done to normalize conversations about mental wellness for law enforcement, firefighters, first responders, and other public safety professionals. This event will take place at the Kiel Community Center on October 20th from 6 pm to 8 pm. This event is FREE.

Posters have been made, one is hanging in our church fellowship hall, and others have been provided to police stations, fire departments, EMT departments, schools, churches, community centers, libraries, banks, Medical facilities, grocery stores in Kiel, Elkhart Lake, New Holstein, Chilton, and Manitowoc County sheriff, and township fire departments.

We hope you will join us on October 20th to hear Officer Meyers share his experience that led him to become an advocate for breaking the silence around mental health issues.




