Greetings good people of Bethlehem!

May the peace of God, which passes all understanding, guard your hearts and minds this YEAR!

What a great year it's been at Bethlehem UCC! So many wonderful things were accomplished in the spirit of Jesus' compassionate love. This community really knows what it is called to do. All of our annual events were successful: the Undy 500, Mission Sunday, food drives, and the Heifer project. Bethlehem's generosity knows no bounds.

One of the major accomplishments of 2025 was the finalization of our WISE initiative. At last year's annual meeting, the congregation approved the covenant. It took until October, (for reasons beyond our control,) but Bethlehem's covenant was certified and we are now listed among the 91 WISE congregations nationwide. This is just the beginning of our work welcoming and advocating for those affected by mental health concerns. Also in October, the WISE team hosted its first community event when Officer Adam Meyers spoke of his struggles with anxiety, depression, and PTSD. We will continue to look for ways that Bethlehem can engage with the greater community around the issue of mental health. If you are interested in joining the WISE team, we'd love to have you!

On a personal level, I wish to thank the people of Bethlehem who supported ME during 2025, and the years preceding, as I worked towards ordination. I have always said, and will continue to say, it is a great honor and pleasure to serve this congregation!

Reverend Randy's Ramblings (continued):

So what's next? I have a few ideas for additions and changes as we move forward. I have been working behind the scenes to complete my "Grief Coach" certification. This additional knowledge and skills will assist me in both my roles as pastor and chaplain, but also allow us the opportunity to hold a GRIEF GROUP at Bethlehem. Stay tuned for details. Also, to allow more time for informal conversation, I am looking to begin holding coffee or breakfast gatherings for those who might be interested. I'm also open to book studies or bible study if it's something the community wants as well. Are there new ministries we should look at?

What can we change? What can we eliminate? Are there old practices that no longer fill a need? Is the worship format meaningful to you? Music? I'm open to your ideas and suggestions. Here are a few things I've been considering:

- We need more fellowship time. If we aren't willing to hold coffee hour EACH Sunday, how about twice a month? Christ's church is built on the concept of community. We aren't intended to live our faith in isolation. "*Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I with them,*" – Matthew 18:20. Let's slow down and engage in conversation. The church doesn't need to be empty fifteen minutes after worship.
- Along those lines, how can we make our space more "homey?" what can be done with the physical space to ENCOURAGE people to sit and talk. I want church to feel like an extension of home, not an institution.
- Finally, out of respect for God's creation, can we please stop using disposable items for eating and drinking??? Especially Styrofoam! I understand people don't want to do dishes, well then maybe it's time to invest in a dishwasher?? Just food for thought!

Let us continue to work together in brotherly and sisterly harmony for the good of all God's children. It is a pleasure to be your pastor and to serve God side-by-side with you. May God bless your 2026!



BETHLEHEM CEMETERY ASSOCIATION

Just a note to let you know who we are.

The Bethlehem Cemetery Association was formed on May 26, 1947. It currently has 41 members. The Cemetery board consists of 3 members, a Director, Treasurer and Clerk. Each position serves a term of 3 years and can be re-elected.

The organization meets once a year. The group is responsible for the upkeep of the cemetery grounds. Bethlehem UCC has also contracted this group to mow the lawn surrounding the church.

The cemetery and the church are separate entities. As a member of the association, you pay dues each year in the amount of \$5.00 and you can purchase a plot in the cemetery at a reduced price. However, you do not have to be a member of the association to purchase a plot. Everyone is welcome! You also do not have to be a member of Bethlehem UCC, this cemetery is open to the public.

From the Church Historian:

As we begin the celebration of 160 years at Bethlehem, here is a look at Baptism at Bethlehem:

Drawing from deep roots in the Reformed tradition, more often than not we practice infant baptism, understanding how beautifully God's grace and love comes to us: arriving in our lives even before we have a chance to choose it for ourselves. Baptism is a simple sacrament; setting the course of a life always bound to the love of God through Jesus Christ. Because it is 'simple, we are taught that there are three things necessary for baptism: water, a person to be baptized and God.

Baptism usually occurs within our Sunday mornings service as the gathered community celebrates and welcomes the newest member into this community of faith. The child's parents and sponsors bring the one to be baptized him or her to the font at the front at the front of the sanctuary for the celebration of the sacrament. Occasionally a baptism is performed at a hospital. Years ago many infants were baptized in their parent's home or even the grandparent's home.


Because we practice (mostly) infant baptism, a special part of the service is the naming of the child for the first time as one of God's beloved in the presence of the Christian community. Our ancient Christian tradition teaches that this act of naming a child offered protection and belonging in God's family. Many children are named after deeply loved family and friends; others carry names with special meanings. This sacrament connects us to the past, present and future. Families mark this in many ways and often it is the baptismal gown (or other clothing) worn by the child has special family significance; such as the same gown worn by a sibling, parent, or even grandparent.

In 1866 a total of 11 children were baptized. The very first being Elisabeth Emma Krause, daughter of Charles and Regina, baptized on April 1, 1866.


The Bethlehem record books name 863 children and 8 adults baptized during its history.

During the month of January, please see the display in the Fellowship Hall of some very old baptismal certificates. Several are more than 100 years old.


