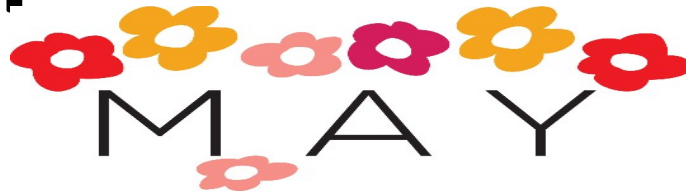

Spring has sprung and it's a busy time at Bethlehem UCC.

By the time you read this, Bethlehem has held its second "WISE" event in our efforts towards community outreach. On April 25, Dr. Cary Johannes instructed a group of approximately thirty people (most not BUCC members!) on strategies for increasing inner peace. Mediation, mindfulness, journaling and other strategies were explored. Participants also received a copy of Dr. Johannes's book, *The Missing Peace*.

Bethlehem recently joined forces with other area UCC churches and collected both food and cleaning items for flood victims in the Shiocton area. Combined, we collected well over 1000 items.

May is Mental Health Awareness month, with Sunday, May 31st being "Mental Health Sunday." A guest speaker is being planned for that day.

May is also our annual Undy 500 underwear drive for the Guest House men's shelter in Milwaukee. *Continued on page 2*

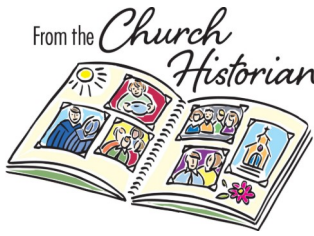
Loads of Love:

From the Historical Records of Bethlehem U.C.C.:



As we continue the celebration of 160 years at Bethlehem, here is a look at the Bethlehem Ladies Aid Society.

For 112 years the Bethlehem Ladies have faithfully carried out the purpose of the group by helping each member with her spiritual needs, by doing special things for the church, by helping local people in need and by donating to worldwide needs.

These things were accomplished with special worship services at their meeting and other special days throughout the year. This group helped beautify the church, and organized help at special celebrations, such as Mission Fest, Ice Cream Social, Family Day, Friendship Day, and World Day of Prayer.

Throughout the years the Ladies organized themselves into many work groups and committees including: Spring Cleaning Group, Cupboard Cleaning Group, Fall Cleaning Group, Children's Day kitchen workers, Mission Fest kitchen workers, Flower and Gift Committee, Dining Room and Kitchen Chairman, Flower Bed Committee, Ice Cream Social Committee, Communion Ware Cleaning, Christmas Party Committee.

To raise money for their activities, dues were set at fifteen cents way back in 1913. Over the years other means to raise funds included hosting the annual Ice Cream Social with Fish Pond, Bake Sale and Bazaar. They also did refunding, brat fries, plant sales, and more Bake Sales.

The treasury of the Ladies helped the church whenever a special need came up, such as furnace at the parsonage, organs, flooring, plumbing, folding chairs, tables, roof, carpeting, oil furnace, kitchen ware, dishes, and the new church building.

The Ladies supported many missions such as Sunburst, Flood Areas, Deaconess Hospital, Mission House, Fort Wayne Children's Home, The Indian School, Christian Services at Sheboygan Armory, Christian Mission at Kiel, Safe Harbor, Christmas Cheer, Senior Center and Nursing Homes. For many years, they sponsored a child in a foreign country. They have also presented scholarships to seminary students.

Within Bethlehem, the Ladies decorated for Harvest Home. They sent gifts at Christmas time to the military servicemen from the congregation as well as college students. They presented hand embroidered handkerchiefs and roses for the newly baptized. Easter Lilies and Christmas Poinsettias were presented by the Ladies.

November 1913 marked the founding of the Ladies Aid Society of Bethlehem with 13 women joining the group. After 112 years, November, 2025 the 6 members of Bethlehem Ladies decided to disband as an active organization. The work of this group has been invaluable in the history of Bethlehem.

During the month of May, please see the display of Bethlehem Ladies memorabilia in the Fellowship Hall. You may notice the group truly enjoyed celebrating special anniversaries and kept detailed notes of their events.
